CLUB GROUNDS EVENT RULES

ABSOLUTELY NO ALCOHOL ON THE GROUNDS.

- OCBSC reserves the right to ask anyone insubordinate to the club rules to leave the premises. All riders do so at their own risk. Each rider (or guardian for juniors) must sign a waiver. OCBSC is not responsible for injury/damage to riders, horses, spectators, or property. All riders (18 and under) MUST wear a properly fitting NYS ASTM certified equestrian helmet when mounted. No bike helmets! If you need to be reminded to wear your helmet more than once, you will forfeit your ride(s) for the night.

- No horses are allowed on the premises without current negative Coggins and rabies vaccine certificates. **Initial here:** _____
- A western dress code is in effect when under the timer – this includes pants, long sleeve button down shirt, ¾ length/short sleeve, or collared western shirt (club shirts are acceptable), hat/helmet, and proper equestrian footwear with a 1 inch heel..

- No running of horses in any area except the arena and designated warm up area. No riding double. **Initial here:** _____
- No re-rides in the event of a fall or equipment failure. Re-rides are at the discretion of the event committee.

- A drag will be done at the discretion of the event chairperson. Absolutely no horses shall be in the arena during drags.

- Only one run per horse/rider combination in the same class. The same horse can run no more than two times per class. Children must be monitored at all times for safety reasons. **Initial here:** _____
- No spectators are allowed at the arena entrance during races. A rider has a maximum of three minutes to get his/her horse into the pen once their name has been called. Only one person (on foot) may aid the rider in getting the horse into the pen. Only one horse may enter the pen. Your horse needs to be under control at all times including when near the pen entrance and when in the pen. A horse kicking out or acting up is detrimental to the safety of those on the ground. All horses and people must stay clear of the alleyway entrance when races are in progress.
